The Center for International Legal Studies is a non-profit research, training, and law publications institute, established and operating under Austrian law and with its international headquarters based in Salzburg, Austria. The Center has operated since 1976 in Salzburg. The Center for International Legal Studies has a close cooperation with the Salzburg Seminar, Suffolk University Law School, Boston, Massachusetts, the Faculty of Law of the University of Salzburg, the Faculty of Law of the University of Amsterdam, The Netherlands, the Faculty of Law of the University of Durham, England, the National University of Chile, and numerous other universities and educational organizations in Europe and the United States.

The essential purpose of the Center for International Legal Studies is the promotion of the dissemination of information among members of the international legal community, this being achieved through the Center's various research and law publication projects, the administration of post-graduate and professional training programs, and the operation of 8 continuing legal education conferences each January and March in Kitzbühel, Austria, each June and November in Salzburg, Austria, each February in Steamboat Springs, Colorado, and selected venues elsewhere such as Chile, the United States, Canada, South Africa and Australia. More than 5,000 lawyers worldwide have been designated as Fellows of the Center for International Legal Studies in recognition of their contributions to the Center's publications and conferences. Nearly 500 Honorary Fellows have taken membership in the Congress of Fellows. The Center provides observers on a regular basis at meetings of the UNCITRAL Commission and its Working Groups in Vienna and New York, and is participating - with a 16 member delegation - in the United Nations' Information Technology Summits scheduled December 2003 in Geneva and November 2005 in Tunis.

The Center publishes a bi-monthly electronic newsletter, encouraging authors worldwide to contribute articles covering the business laws and legal trends of their countries. Newsletter subscription is free.
